Old Town Cape to host downtown Commercial Open House

CAPE GIRARDEAU, MO. – Old Town Cape will host a downtown Commercial Open House on Thursday, September 27 from 4 to 7 p.m. Seven properties will be showcased during the tour that was organized by Old Town Cape and sponsored by Realty Executives and Banterra Bank. Each property will be open to tour and participants can start the tour at any of the properties. Someone will be present at each property to answer questions.

The tour was organized as a way to highlight properties available for lease or purchase in the downtown area. “We want people to know that there are great opportunities in downtown,” noted Stan Penn, chair of the Old Town Cape Economic Restructuring committee. “It is a way to reach some people who may not otherwise have the chance to see these buildings and talk about their potential. We want people to consider downtown for business and investment.”

The properties are located at 1227 Broadway, 1105 Broadway, 635 Broadway, 325 Broadway, 121 Broadway, 36 North Main and 20 North Main.

The property at 20 North Main will serve as the reception area where participants can get additional information, talk about opportunities and resources and see the vision of downtown. Present at the reception area will be the Executive Director of Old Town Cape and representatives from the Cape Girardeau Area Chamber of Commerce, the City of Cape Girardeau and the sponsors. Other resource people that can answer questions regarding the rehabilitation of buildings and doing business in the downtown area will also be on hand. Refreshments will be available.
